There have been many changes since we last spoke. Let me start by introducing you to our Executive Director, Brian Elliot. Brian comes to us with a very strong financial background. He has worked on the affordable housing spectrum for over a decade and is a strong advocate for our community.

Over the last year, we have developed a robust organization structure to include a Fund Development and Digital Marketing Manager, Volunteer Coordinator, Program Manager, Case Managers, Support Staff, Kitchen Coordinator, Custodial Support and Security. As the numbers of our guests continue to rise, we are always in need of more staff and volunteers. It takes a minimum of 400 volunteer hours monthly to keep our doors open. We can't do it without YOU!

We continue to grow and develop our Partnership Program both financially and gifts in kind. We brought back our Shamrock Shuffle in March 2023. We saw a very successful day, and thanks to the continued generosity of Central United Church, we are planning for March 23, 2024. 

SUCCESS STORIES



Emily (name changed for privacy) presented at shelter after no longer being able to stay in supportive housing. She was provided a space after staying outside for over a month. She discovered she was pregnant not too long after. Right away, Emily was assisted by The INN staff who reached out a program that would be able to support her and her future child. Emily found support from a local clinic, and she met with a doctor and nurse each week at The INN. She was able to access the hospital when experiencing complications with her health. The INN provided transportation to and from hospital by taxi vouchers. Once a housing program that was a fit for her needs accepted the referral, case managers from The INN connected with community partners to help arrange transport to the intake appointment and a few weeks later, her move in date. Staff at The INN supported her in organizing the items she needed to bring with her including supplies for her expected child. Both are healthy and housed still.

Storv 2

Walter (name changed for privacy) had experienced homelessness for just over 5 years and was recently housed. This client had many barriers facing him when it came to finding and securing safe and affordable housing. The staff at the shelter, with the assistance of community partners such as Social Services, Indwell, our local MP's office and a few others helped Walter overcome those barriers. We were able to help him get ID, fill out required housing paperwork, complete assessments, ensure his taxes were completed, and attended meetings to help him be his best self. With all the support that was offered to this client, he was able to move into his own apartment.
